Townshend Painted Theater Curtains

Restored and Hanging in the

Townshend Town Hall and Opera House Thursday, Oct. 14, 2004 at 7:00 P.M.

Presenter: Christine Hadsel

Director of the VT Painted Theater Curtains Project

No admission fee. ~ All are welcome.

A project to restore painted theatre curtains hanging in the Townshend Town Hall and Opera House has just been completed by The Vermont Museum & Gallery Alliance of Woodstock, Vermont, under the direction of Christine Hadsel. The Townshend Town Hall was given to the town by Mrs. Henry F. Dutton and dedicated in June 1921. It replaced the town hall building which burned down in the fire of 1918.

William R. Stuart (1861-1935), a well-known Brattleboro artist noted for his stage scenery and scenic panels, painted five of the six curtains in the 1920s. Lee Lash painted the sixth curtain

At the special showing on October 24, 2004, each curtain, 25 ft. long x 16 ft. high, will be lowered by hand, beginning with the curtain farthest backstage and continuing to the front. All curtains have new rigging. The various painted scenes show a city street with a trolley car, a locomotive, a meadow, a city park, a Western landscape, and a mountain brook.


Project director, Chris Hadsel will give a short slide show of curtains in other Vermont towns and talk about the restoration process. She says, "The objective was to give the curtains a once-in-a-century clean and mend that will keep them around for present enjoyment and future pleasure and pride."


